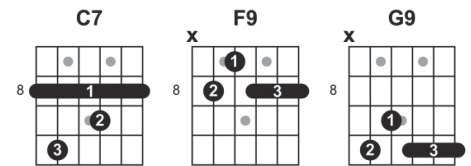

Rock This House [Black Top]. This reissue of the Hollywood Fats Band's self-titled (and only) LP from 1979 (on PBT International -- long a collector's item) could be either lauded for being incredibly authentic or knocked for being a bit apish -- were it not for the level of musicianship from **Mike "Fats" Mann** on guitar, **Al Blake** on harp, **Fred Kaplan** on piano, **Richard Innes** on drums, and **Canned Heat's Larry Taylor** on upright bass. Great ensemble groove -- including six additional tracks here -- although the excitement Fats could generate live never really translated to the studio.
